Both Programs 2025-2027

- All roads
- All public agencies & tribal governments are eligible
- Projects must:
 - Comply with funding requirements
 - Be in (or added to) local
 Transportation Improvement
 Program
 - No match is required

Pedestrian and Bicycle Program

- ~\$23 million expected for the 2025-2027 biennium
- Multi-Modal Account and Climate Commitment Act (state funds)
- Application due May 31, 2024
- No minimum or maximum request limits.



Safe Routes to School Program

- ~\$25.6 million expected for the 2025-2027 biennium
- Multi-Modal Account, Climate Commitment Act & Infrastructure Investment & Jobs Act (state & federal funds)
- Application due June 7, 2024
- No minimum or maximum request limits. Nonprofit entities are eligible.










Existing Roadway Section-NE 153rd PL, 80' ROW




Proposed Roadway Section-NE 153rd PL, 80' ROW



Existing 60' ROW




Proposed 60'ROW

CCA Requirements for Tribal Consultation

According to RCW 70A.65.305 applicants are required to conduct early, meaningful, and individual consultation with any affected federally recognized tribe on all funding decisions and funding programs that may impact tribal ribal cultural resources, archaeological sites, sacred sites, fisheries, or other rights tribe or tribes possess rights reserved or protected

- 3. If you have not received a response from the tribes in 30 days, follow-up with them. If you do not hear back from the tribe note the lack of response in your documentation.
- Document your consultation efforts in a memo and include it with your application. Include the tribes you contacted, outreach details such as the date(s) and method(s) used, any response including concerns identified and how any concerns were addressed.
